Deadlines for courses planned for the autumn of 2023

For the coming semester we are trying something new; two separate deadlines for course syllabi, depending on if it's a freestanding course or a programme course. This to allow extra time for review and establishing of syllabi for freestanding courses that also apply for funding from the Course and Programme Committee (KPK).

The deadlines that apply for courses planned for the autumn semester of 2023 are:

Syllabi

15 February 2023	Deadline for submitting (for review) a new or revised syllabus in
	KIWAS for a course that applies for funding via KPK .
22 February 2023	Deadline for submitting (for review) a new or revised syllabus in
	KIWAS for a course that applies for funding via doctoral
	programmes.
8 May 2023	Deadline for submitting (for review) a new or revised syllabus in
	KIWAS for courses that are planned within the research
	schools.

Application for funding from KPK

15 February 2023	Deadline for application for funding from KPK (including for
	so called <u>additional costs in international collaborations</u>).
This only refers to courses that are <u>not</u> part of a doctoral programme or are to be	
wholly financed in another way, see <u>Applying for funding of freestanding courses</u> .	

Course occasions/planned course dates

15 March 2023	Deadline for entering a <u>course occasion</u> in KIWAS
29 May 2023	Deadline for reporting planned course occasions within the
	research schools for the autumn semester of 2023,
	according to instructions that will be sent via email.

Record number of course applications for spring 2023

We had a record number of applications via the course catalogue for the spring semester of 2023 (VT23), in total 3 130 applications (however not unique *applicants*)! Normally, the total number is around 2 700.

We don't know the reason for this, but one explanation could be the higher number of admitted to doctoral education during the spring semester this year. The fact that the large number of course applications mainly concern the compulsory or generic courses points to that connection.

The number of new doctoral students at KI during the current semester seems to be landing at a normal level, now that we are approaching the end of the year, which means that we may expect normal number of course applications in the next course catalogue.

Automated mailing of course evaluation reports

The evaluation team at the unit Teaching and Learning (TL) now have activated automated mailing of course evaluation reports to the course providers. This means that as soon as the response time has ended, the reports (one full and one short version) are automatically generated by KI Survey and sent to the course director and any contact persons indicated in the course catalogue.

However, to make this work **each recipient needs to have logged in to the system once**. After the first login, a profile is created, which is all that is needed. Follow the link for login, choose Karolinska Institutet, and login with you KI account.

In January, TL will begin piloting the corresponding automated mailing of the short report directly to the *course participants*

A general reminder about course evaluations: For evaluation team at TL to be able to submit the course evaluations to your participants, please remember to <u>send them your participant lists in time</u>.
