The year is coming to an end, but before we all head off for the holidays, we would like to remind you of important dates and news to keep in mind when planning your courses. More information will be sent in January when our web sites are updated.

Fubas soon to be put into use

By the turn of the year, we will start using Fubas as the system supporting doctoral courses – for syllabi, course catalogue, application, and admission. KIWAS will be closed for updates but will be kept for reference for some time for those of you who are offering courses during the spring semester.

Syllabi are migrated

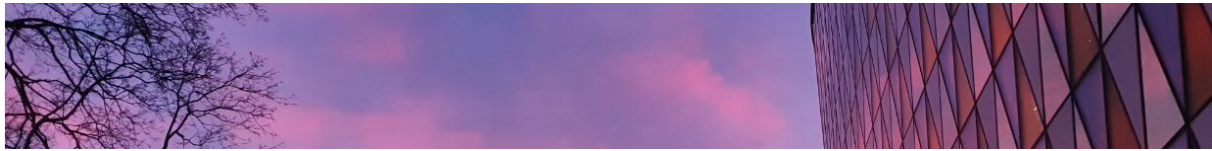
Course syllabi have been migrated from KIWAS to Fubas, but only for courses that are planned for the coming few semesters (according to planning made for doctoral programmes, research schools as well as for freestanding mandatory and/or general science courses).

The course numbers (four digits) are the same but have been complemented with department code and an F for a full course code, just like in Ladok (example: C7F1234).

More information in progress

We are currently working on **updating the web sites for course providers and for doctoral students**, including **new web pages about Fubas** where you will find user manuals.

Deadlines for courses planned for the autumn of 2024 (HT24)

The deadlines that apply for courses planned for the autumn semester of 2024 are ([the full list is also available on the web](#)):

Syllabi

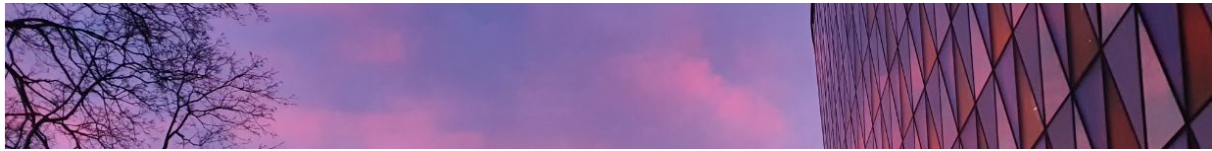
15 February 2024	Deadline for submitting (for review) a new or revised syllabus in our new system Fubas for a course that will be advertised in the course catalogue (HT24).
6 May 2024	Deadline for submitting (for review) a new or revised syllabus in KI WAS for courses that are planned within the research schools in the autumn semester 2024 (HT24).

Application for funding from KPK

15 February 2024	Deadline for applying for funding from KPK for the autumn semester 2024 (if this wasn't done already during HT23).
Only refers to courses that are not part of a doctoral programme or are to be wholly financed in another way, see Applying for funding of freestanding courses .

Course information & course occasions

15 March 2024	Deadline for entering a course information and a course occasion in Fubas for advertising in the course catalogue for the autumn semester 2024.
27 May 2024	Deadline for reporting planned course occasions within the research schools , with start date during the autumn semester 2024, according to instructions.



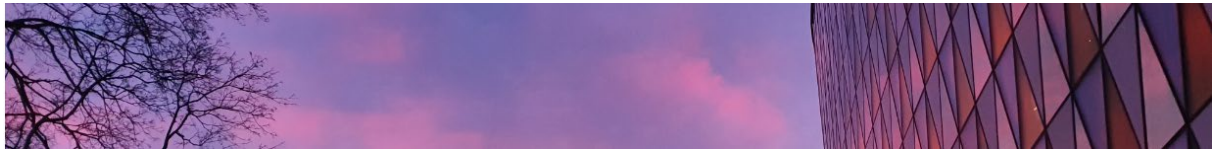
New features in Fubas

A couple of things that are new as we move to Fubas:

- The syllabus template is designed with two language versions. However, just like today you only need to have a syllabus in the **teaching language** of the course.
- Many text fields have one or more proposed wordings. Start by downloading **standard texts** for the field in question.
- We will no longer use an asterisk (*) to mark courses that are **mandatory or general science courses**. Instead we refer to the web page [Course requirements and choice of courses for doctoral students](#) as a guide for doctoral students to find courses for their ISP. In the course catalogue it will also be possible to filter on **Type of course**.
- **To advertise a course in the course catalogue** you will need, apart from a syllabus, both a so-called **course information** and a **course occasion**. Both are created in Fubas. This is what distinguishes these:

Course information	Course occasion
<i>A more permanent description of the course, in addition to what is stated in the syllabus. For example:</i>	<i>Provides information specific to this particular course occasion. For example:</i>
A "selling" description of the course	Number of course places
Selection criteria (course specific)	Start and end date
If it belongs to a doctoral programme	Application period (same for all)
Type of course	Description of arrangement (e.g. campus/online, full or half speed)
Keywords	Link to course evaluation report
Course director	Person(s) authorized to perform admission
Contact person

need to create a course information **and** a course occasion. Next time only a course occasion is needed.

- Everyone with a KI ID will be able to access all syllabi in Fubas. Each syllabus version has a unique web link that you can use on for example a website. Keep in mind that only persons with a KI ID can access the link, so if you want the syllabus to be available outside KI it needs to be shared in another way. Note: in the course catalogue the syllabus is an attached PDF, accessible for anyone.

Support for doctoral courses and new co-worker

We will both be working in Fubas as well as using the functional email address doctoralcourses@ki.se supporting course providers in the processes for courses.
