Track record & Research Mission statement

As a researcher leader, my goals is to advance an approach that situates the topic of health within a socioeccological context. Such an approach needs to incorporate methodologies and conceptual apparatus from various disciplines to target health from vantage points of society, institutions, individuals, and communities. As a scientist, I have extensive experience of self-report assessments, and scientific skills to address the contextual and cross-cultural issues involved in obtaining valid information on these bases. I have worked in development and validation of measures for assessment and screening in a large number of populations ranging from patients with cancer to school age refugee minors. I have combined these class of *empiri* with **clinical-, and community** aggregate-level data, large registry-based data (with a focus on labour market), and have also conducted **intervention studies**. My core interests are anchored in the real-life domains of health, social, and human phenomena that could be empirically studied and understood to improve lives of individuals and populations. I have **initiated large scale** population-based self-report data collection work in forced migrant populations in Sweden, and have worked extensively on methodological, theoretical, and empirical anchoring of the constructs of social participation, social support, post-migratory living conditions, resiliency, and coping. During the last 5 years, my work has been focused on the design and implementation of **longitudinal studies of refugee health** for fine grain delineating the process of post-resettlement change in health in relation to social contexts. In my work as a research leader, I have initiated extensive collaborations with the civil society, government agencies and local municipalities, and have had a significant output in media outlets.
